

The first in the Horse Diaries series, this lively chapter book is set in Iceland around 1000 BCE, where the filly named Elska by âœthe peopleâ• tells of her life, from her birth in the short summer months to her fun with the herd, running and playing through the long, cold, dark winter, and then her pride as she grows bigger and works, âœcircling around to gather up all the sheep.â• The setting is always a dynamic part of the novel, and there are photos and notes at the back about the Icelandic horse and its cultural significance. But there is a real story, too, as Elska bonds with a young girl and then is wrenched away. Sandersonâ™s occasional, beautiful drawings add to the drama. The book is written in chapters and introduces children to the complex stories of multiple dialogue, switching scenes, etc.

I just purchased this book (the Kindle edition) earlier today. My 6 1/2 year old daughter loved this book so much that she read the entire book in a few hours time. She can't wait for me to get more in

the series. She said this was one of her favorite books that she has read. My almost 9 year old daughter is also very excited to read this book as soon as she finishes the one she is currently reading. She did not always enjoy reading, so I love it when we are able to find books and series of books that she likes.
