Again, we find ourselves in a world that is easy to visualize, with characters that pop off of the pages. And all of that is surrounded by war, love, fighting, friendships, sacrifice and hope. But upon rejoining her unit, military life has become vastly different since she is now herself, as a female. She is harassed and so many times I wanted to reach my hands into the book and punch the person that was tormenting her. She tried her hardest to rise above their sexism and hatred and show them that she deserved to be there just as much, if not more, then they did! Her first flight into a war scene was epic! Definitely one of my favorite aspects about this series is the relationships that unfold. Especially the one between Aris and Milek. And I am so happy that I can finally talk about how I fell madly in love with Milek in the Rebel Wing! Especially the cave scene, he's so sexy, tough and charming without even trying. He has such a huge heart and the decisions he made were admirable and warmed my heart. Another one of my favorite relationships in this book was between Aris and Dysis. Dysis was Aris' bunkmate who also disguised herself as a man in Rebel Wing. So I am beyond ecstatic that we get to see this true friendship again. This is how female relationships should be written! Dysis and Aris' friendship was strong, honest, and they loved and protected each other. It warmed my heart seeing it flow throughout the pages. Like Rebel Wing, we find ourselves following many different people throughout the story, where Aris is still the main lead. And while it makes a well-rounded story, there were some situations where it made me pause. For example, there were moments that I also wanted to be with Aris and Milek, when instead we were with Dysis. And here is where I get a little lost because I still wanted that scene with Dysis. Yet I wanted a little bit more of Aris during those times too. A few of those situations flitted throughout the story, and while I was happy to be reading what I was, I also wanted to be elsewhere at the same time, which left me a little confused with my feelings. But thankfully this time around, I never had an issue with names. Even when old faces made a reappearance. And I was happily surprised with how much action Aris and her fellow friends found themselves in. It made for a thrilling ride again and again. I love when a book finds the

perfect harmony of mixing smiles with sweaty palms, and Storm Fall definitely hit it! So now I'm off to read the final installment, and I can't wait to see how this group will fare. Absolutely LOVED this book. It was so great to be back with the characters from Rebel Wing. Follow up books and the second in a trilogy especially are always tricky for me as a reader. I'm often let down with a second book to a book I loved as much as I loved Rebel Wing. This was so not the case with STORM FALL! As Aris would say, "Oh Holy!" That was pretty much my reaction throughout the whole book. I don't want to give too much away, but to say the action is NON STOP would not be an exaggeration. This book veers into areas and plots I would never have expected, but it also has some really great quiet, emotional scenes running deep throughout it all, too. Reading this book is like being strapped into the passenger seat of Aris's wingjet, with all the ups and downs and dips and rises and fun and fear. Emotions galore! Plus, of course, Milek . . . Ooh la la! (Aside: Looking forward to even more of him in book 3 - fingers crossed!) And it was nice to see a bit more of the Calix storyline too. There were also some wonderful moments of friendship and honor and just overall Aris's badass-ness that just made Storm Fall every bit as amazing as book 1. If you thought Aris was awesome in Rebel Wing, just wait until you see her now.

Although I enjoyed the 1st book in this trilogy more, this is a decent follow up that continues Aris's personal and professional growth. I am disappointed that the author felt compelled to expand on the romance already. This is a young girl still a little unsure of herself trying to gain the respect of her fellow servicemen and fit into a man's world. Why complicate matters by entering into a relationship almost immediately after ending a prior one? It makes her seem needy, and I don't think it a good message for young readers. Other than that, I like Aris's character. The story continues Aris's adventures as the war between Atalanta and Safara escalates, bringing some old friends together and losing others. Although this is definitely geared to YA, it's good writing and good reading for people of any age looking for a little escapist fun.

I got this as soon as I finished Rebel Wing and this one was as good as that one. Wow. These books are intense. My big problem is that I discovered them before the series was finished. I have to wait until sometime this summer for the third (and, I assume, final) book to come out. There isn't a cliff hanger though and lots of credit to the author for that. The books are good enough that you will read the next ones because you want to. I am really invested in this story and highly recommend

this book to any dystopian fan. I've read a lot of reviews that say that, if you don't like bad language, you should stick to Christian books. This is a prime example of why we shouldn't have to. I loved it.

Still enjoying this trilogy! This time Banghart upped the action and the stakes. I wish there was more flying, to be honest, but in its place was a nice exploration of character relationships and gaining perspective in war while grappling with change and acceptance of women as soldiers. If you liked the first book, you'll like this next installment as Banghart sticks to her themes and grows her characters from them. I do also kinda wish this book was longer because I just didn't really want it to end.

Female viewpoint science fiction that grabs you up will keep you turning pages. I think this was intended for young females but I am a over 60 retired military male who really enjoyed the book and the whole trilogy.

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
