

The information and illustrations are amazing, BUT they become very overwhelming when

competing with "shared" layout pages. The reader cannot enjoy exploring one hat without being distracted by the next hat on the joining page. As a kindergarten teacher, I will have to bend the book back to minimize the distractions from the oncoming page if I choose to use this book as a Shared Read-a-Loud. If this is a pattern for ALL the "Whose Is It?" Books [Picture Window Books, Capstone Publisher], this will be my ONLY purchase.

I read the story to my first graders and they got very excited about guessing who would fill the hat. I only gave it four stars because I really think the author could (and should) have added a few more hats. I did like that the author "mixed it up" a bit putting women in non-traditional roles.

My preschool students really liked this book! They requested that we read it 2 more times after I originally read it to them. It can get a little tricky when they try to read ahead on the next page. I had to keep folding the book over so they couldn't see what was coming next.

Really fun for teaching jobs and of those who work in our communities. It's really fun to let the kids (I used it to teach kindergartners) guess who and what the profession is. Highly recommended for teaching about different jobs.

My 2-year old loves this book. I am underwhelmed with the images and info. It is very simple, but he loves it and there is nothing offensive about it.
