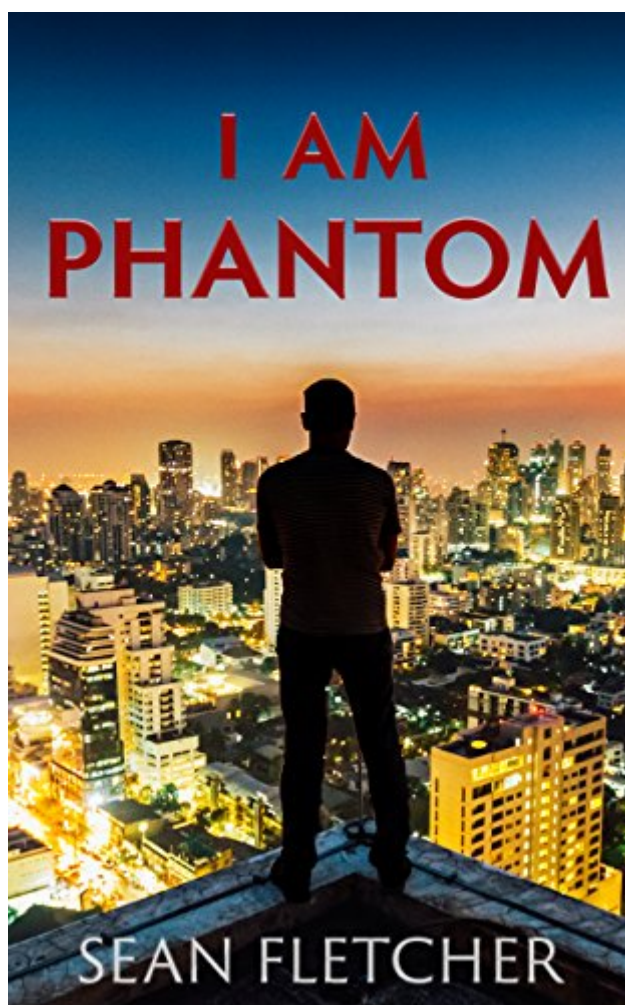


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I Am Phantom

I Am Phantom is a fantastic superhero novel, and an excellent debut. The protagonist, Drake is likeable and interesting. Even though Drake's powers aren't unique to him alone, you empathize with him easily, and I was cheering on him and his crew the whole time. I liked all of the main characters friends, although my favorite of the four (Matt, Melanie, Liz, and Cody) was definitely Melanie. That being said, I would say the most complex character was Ryans, and I didn't expect (but enjoyed quite a bit) the twisty history that he had. It was pretty hard for me to pin down his agenda until much later in the book. I grew attached to the characters as I read on, and became invested in what happened to them. Sykes was...interesting for me, and very creepy at times. Well done. The plot wasn't incredibly complex, but it was a fun read and there were several twists that I wasn't expecting. The action scenes were well written, not boring blow by blow but enough to know exactly what was happening. During the fight scenes there was kind of the feeling you get when reading a superhero comic or watching an action movie, so I'd say that's a good sign. While there was violence, it wasn't overdone. As a first book, I was really impressed. I easily slipped into the world and the characters. Where there was tension, I was tense. (The mental hospital scene, I was reading in the dark...and I definitely turned on some lights to read the rest of the way through). Decisions made by the protagonist and friends had consequences for them, and sometimes serious ones, which I found refreshing in comparison to many novels where events and decisions have no meaning or effect. The writing was good with minimal grammatical errors (if any), and I could visualize almost every scene in my head. When I picked it up, I sped through it. Overall, I really enjoyed the book, and would definitely buy a sequel. The book's ending leaves open the opportunity for one, and I would love to see it happen. With relate-able characters, effortless reading, and interesting twists, it's an easy choice for me.

I Am Phantom features a likable superhero protagonist, Drake Sinclair, who must fight to protect a college town "and possibly the world" from a terrifying villain. When Drake leaves his

life in Bhutan to attend Queensbury University in North Carolina, he gets far more than a college education. Drawn by a mysterious note from someone named "L.S." who may know why Drake has superhuman physical powers, Drake embarks on a quest to understand his own origins, discover his calling, and learn how best to use his special abilities and martial arts training. His journey leads him to a series of shocking revelations and throws him and his tightly knit group of friends into increasingly perilous situations. A highly readable and entertaining debut novel, *I Am Phantom*'s cinematic qualities reminded me of movies like *X-Men* and *the Fantastic Four*. Drake relates the story in straightforward, first person prose touched with humor and complete with kinetic fight scenes, blood, bodies and explosions more than enough to keep even reluctant readers entertained. Following a fiery crisis scene, the satisfying denouement allows room for a possible series.

This is essentially a comic book in book form. Actually, the story's not too bad...but the book could use some very serious editing! The book format on the kindle also left something to be desired as it did not respond to different fonts and the only two font sizes that appeared to be available were very tiny or extra large. This is yet another origin super-hero story. Kind of a cross between the Batman and Spider-man. The Phantom, in our story, has a group of friends (side-kicks) that assist him as he attempts to rid the city, Queensbury, NC, of its evil elements. Like any super-hero the Phantom has his nemesis, someone by the name of Sykes, and the Phantom is obsessed with finding out everything there is to know about him. There are the usual young adult angst of first love, dating, fitting in to social circles etc. There is plenty of graphic violence in the book and dead bodies everywhere so if you don't like that kind of scenario skip this book. Bottom line: a fun read (guilty) that's fast paced but the lack of good editing and the book format took away from the enjoyment.
