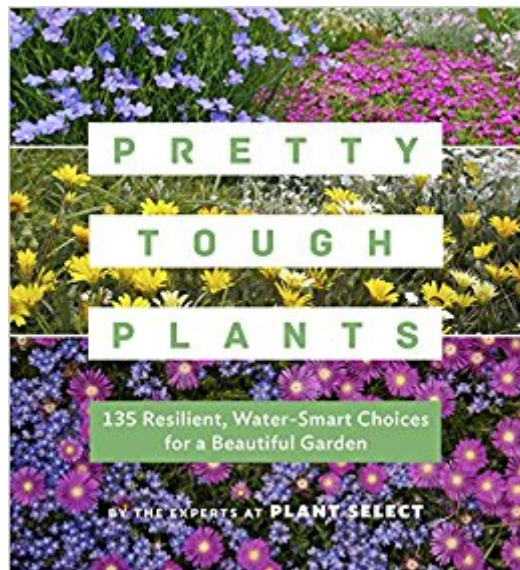

My day job is teaching homeowners how to landscape for the arid Intermountain West. *Pretty Tough Plants* offers up a wide range of plant choices which are less commonly used in this area than they should be. Many of the plants in the book are found in my own yard as well as the conservation-based garden where I work. I would recommend this book for homeowners who are tired of babying plants that don't quite fit our environment. The plants shared are tried and tested in numerous gardens here in the west and help ensure landscape success for homeowners. A copy of this book was donated to the library for our botanical garden but I liked it well enough to purchase my own copy as well.

I live in Denver and it's as if this book was written for me and my fellow home owners! Written by the experts at Plant Select (a not-for-profit organization started in the 1980s as a collaboration between Denver Botanic Gardens and Colorado State University in Fort Collins), this book is a must-have companion for those of us in the Mountain West that would like to conserve water, beautify our spaces and have time on the weekends to enjoy the mountains we so love instead of mowing, weeding and working a part-time job to pay our lawn-watering bill. I have purchased or borrowed numerous books that I thought would be good information on Xeric landscaping here in Denver. This one is the single-most helpful. It has all the information I need. I have a library copy of this book in my hands now. It is so darn good I'm going to purchase this from . Truly a great companion. Note: many of the suggested plants in the book come from one or two sources (specifically, High Country Gardens out of Santa Fe). It can feel a bit like an advertisement for them. But, I can live with that. These plants are absolutely amazing (my favorite being the Blonde Ambition blue grama grass).

One or two glossy pages per plant with great pictures of each. All the information you need is here: bloom time; soil type; USDA hardiness zone; light and water requirements; and whether the plant attracts pollinators or is deer-resistant. A table in the back of the book neatly summarizes all these characteristics. Highly recommended for novice and experienced gardeners alike.

I am a Plant Select lover. I bought my first variety (sunset hyssop) around 1998 and have searched out and planted these varieties ever since. At first I didn't think the book would be useful to me since I am so familiar with these plants. I have several of the pamphlets they publish but with this book, everything is one place. There is new information on most and even how to propagate many of

them. The photos are great. If you live where I do in the dryer regions it is a great wish book to help you dream about what and where to plant next. I highly recommend it.
