

4.5 Stars! Because I couldn't possibly write a review for each of these books individually, this is a review of the original Fever series (books 1 through 5). Not only would it be too difficult to

review them on an individual basis, but it just wasn't going to happen because I couldn't stop long enough between books to even be bothered to write a review. I devoured these books. This is so not my cup of tea. I'm a traditional girl. I like believability, relatability, and normalcy. I like original and unique stories but ones that could happen in real life. Fantasy or paranormal? Usually, we don't mesh. This series is definitely an exception. It did have drawbacks. It was long, at times very drawn out (mostly toward the end), and thoroughly confusing. I know it was the author's intention to keep us guessing and on the edge of our seats, but it got to the point where I had hardly any idea what was going on and it became frustrating. There are so many different facets to this story, so many unnatural laws at play, that it's hard to keep everything straight. The game is constantly changing, there's so many players, and the board is unfathomably large. Every time you think you're winning, Moning has rewritten the rules. But in her defense, it does keep you interested. You become desperate to know what happens. You root for good to trump evil and you rethink what it means to be either one. I was so drawn in to this story and the unforgettable, gripping characters. Mac and Barrons are damn near perfection. Their chemistry is like nothing I've ever experienced between two characters. This is the ultimate slow burn. It doesn't get any slower and hotter than these two. Their tension is so powerful. They make you feel so much by doing and saying next to nothing. They are unforgettable. Take a step out of your comfort zone and read these books. You need to experience this world and these characters. Karen Marie Moning's imagination is a work of art. I think if my brain was capable of creating a story of this magnitude, I'd go insane. It's probably why she writes. Lucky for us.

for her. But the story must go forward and she has a plan."Safety is a fence, and fences are for sheep. I would rather die at twenty-two, knowing the truth, then live in a cage of lies for a hundred years."All the main players are back and while not everything is resolved I thought that so much of it was that I didn't care about a few points that weren't. Mac 5.0 now has had a few realizations since the death of the beast on the cliff. Hindsight always 20/20 and her new plan created some strange bedfellows with odd repercussions. I will say that KMM kept me guessing with who Mac really was I had multiple theories throughout the book and I am happy to say all of them were wrong, I love it when the answer is so creative and well thought out that even though there were clues to the real answer I don't guess it. Also we learn who killed Alina in this book and why. Even though part of what happened to Alina was like I thought the other part tragically didn't and bravo again to KMM for twisting my heartstrings. All I can say is that the story was well paced the sexual tension was exquisite between Barrons and Mac and I couldn't have wanted them to work out any other way. There were surprises around every corner and just when you think you've settled in for a smooth ride you are wrong. I could not put this book down for anything else going on in my life much to my husband's chagrin. The final showdown with the book was amazing and the final twist fantastic thank you KMM. Mac and Barrons have become one of my favorite ships in literature and I love that KMM wrote such an imperfect main character. He is not the hero or antihero waiting to be redeemed. He is solid in who and what he is and makes no apologies for it take him or leave him as he is he is perfectly imperfect and I swoon for him anyway along with Mac."When you know who I am. Let me be your man."The Fever world was one I definitely enjoyed and I will say that the final two books in the series are some of the best I've read for adults in UF.

When I first started this series I had no idea how much of an addiction it would become. By far the best series I have ever read, it was one hell of a roller coaster ride and Shadowfever the fifth book to the Fever series lived up to it. I devoured the almost 600 page book. Every free moment that I had Shadowfever was in my hands and there were several times I lost track of time. It was wrapped up very well and left me very satisfied as a reader. Shadowfever was full of surprises, I didn't see any of it coming. There were a lot of minor characters from the previous books that you find out actually played bigger roles than you thought in the grand scheme of things, and the ending well I never would have expected it. So many lies and secrets surface in this book making it a thrilling and engaging read. After reading the Fever series I have become a huge fan of Moning and will pretty much pick up anything she writes. I am so glad to know she will be writing two more books to the series later on. Right now I'm excited to read her new trilogy coming out Fever World which will be a

spin off of Fever with some key characters such as Dani, Christian, and Ryodan. But I will anxiously be waiting for the sixth and seventh book to the Fever series which wont be coming out for a few very long years because I would love nothing more then to dive back into the lives of Mac and Barrons.
