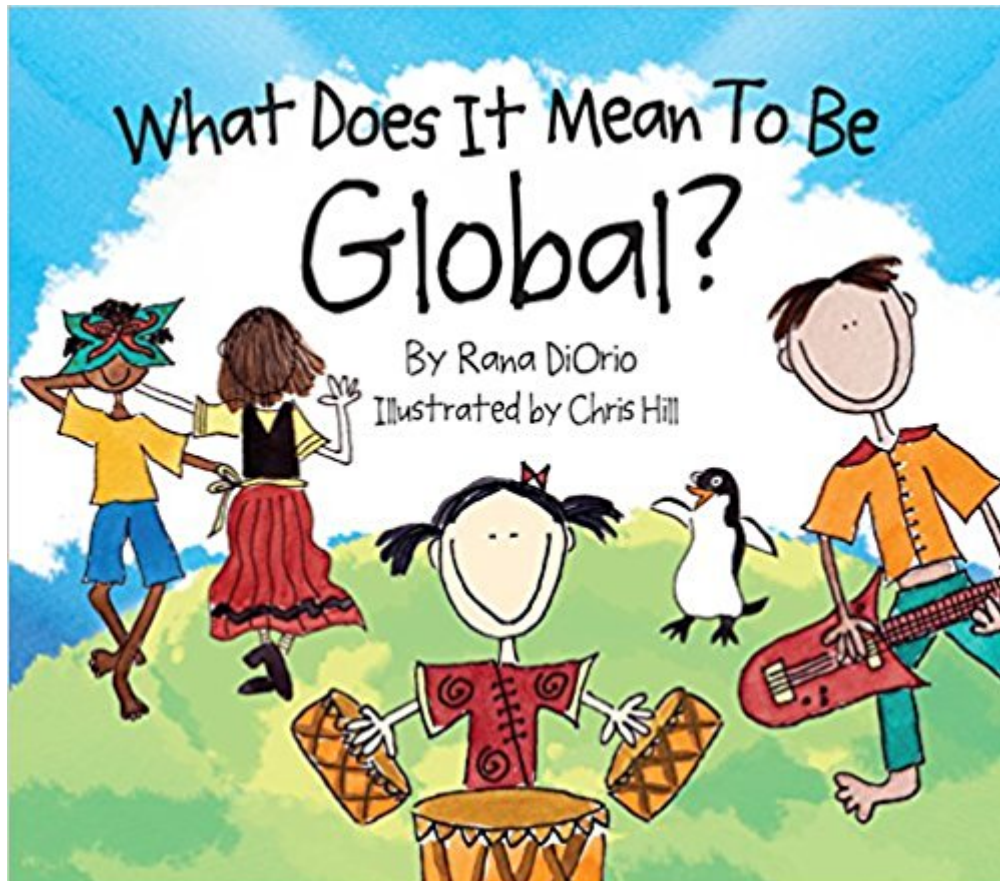

"What Does it Mean to be Global" is a wonderful addition to Rana DiOrio's "What Does it Mean..." series. It follows the same pattern as the others, introducing the subject with a somewhat silly question about what being global means. For example, "Does it mean being really round?" to which

the answer is a resounding "No". I love this, as it brings the child into the story right away, yelling, "NO!" at all the appropriate places. DiOrio then goes on to explain what it means to be global in simple, easy to understand terms such as "living respectfully and peacefully with one another." This is such an important issue in today's increasingly small world, and this book is an excellent resource for stimulating discussion about it with our children. There are even lesson plans available for free to download from Little Pickle Press that are great for parents and teachers both.

This book is the perfect introduction to the idea of being more appreciative, tolerant and accepting of all people in all instances! It is a helpful conversation starter for teachers and parents and makes a wonderful gift for children between the ages of 2 and 10.
