And the official translation here leaves much to be desired. I'm not going to state every single thing I found to come off wrong/different, but instead focus on one scene. The part where Hide and Kaneki are in the sewers. I'm sure everyone knows the iconic line, "Let's go home" by Hide, right? Even in the anime when Hide and Kaneki saw each other again, it was translated that way, albeit the scene being very different. But they really messed up here. I'm not sure what the translator was thinking, maybe they hadn't watched the anime or read it before? Who knows, but they translated it as "Let's get outta here". Really? Really. Really.....I know I'm being snobby and overreactingahaha but it's always been my favorite scene in the series since the chapter came out, and while I should be used to the official translations always being garbage (like with Bakugou in BNHA where they borderline ruin his character taking away his edginess to make the manga 13+ and having him say "crap" "freaking" etc...), this really upset me...
