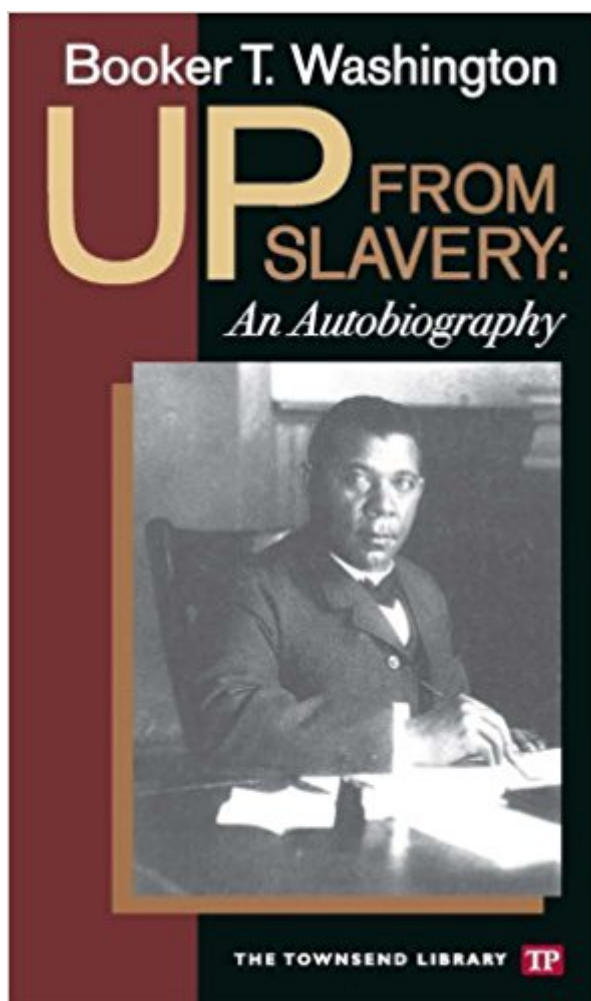


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Up From Slavery: An Autobiography (Townsend Library Edition)
