He received a Tezuka Award Honorable Mention in 2006, and after publishing several short stories in Akamaru Jump, his first serialized work in Weekly Shonen Jump was Oumagadoki Doubutsuen in 2010. My Hero Academia is his third series in Weekly Shonen Jump.

I enjoy this anime. And after the first season i wanted to read the manga. After reading all the volumes i can say the anime does a great job staying close to this manga! I suggest to all my friends to read this series!

This manga really captures the essence of the superhero genre. It's a testament to never giving up, always improving oneself and the nobility of serving others and society before oneself. Give it a try, I don't think you'll be disappointed!

If you're on the fence as to whether to try this series (like I was) give it a go. The characters are fun and interesting, the world has depth and limitations (and history!) and the art starts well and gets better as you go. As you go, there are references to Western culture and American comics, so if you know anything about those, you'll have at least a chuckle.

One of my favorite types of stories is watching an underdog as they train hard to improve themselves, shaping their own lives as well as influencing the people around them. Izuku shows that a strong heart is the great power any hero can have. The characters range from funny to interesting and I'm impressed with the author's ability to add new twists to some of the most classical super powers.

I was not a huge fan of manga and anime a little while ago until adult swim made kekkaishi. Since then I loved the soul eater anime, one piece, naruto, 7 deadly sins, that assasin high anime, and now this! I now am so wanting to make my own manga! Hope it could be like this!

I have watched the anime before reading the manga, and I got hooked. I know a lot of people compare My hero Academia to One punch Man but it's actually quite different from that one. I like the story line and basically the whole setting of the series. The main character Midoriya is adorable - not just appearance wise but also admirable for his determination to not give up his dreams. If you are triggered by bullying, this first volume is going to be a rather hard read but I assure you it gets better. Much better. Overall it's really promising, I love the characters (most of them anyways lol) and the story! I recommend this if you like hero themed comics!

My Hero Academia Vol. 1 is a great introduction to what's being touted as the next "big thing" in Shonen Jump manga. It's got fun characters, interesting powers and a classic underdog story that's just beginning to unfold.
