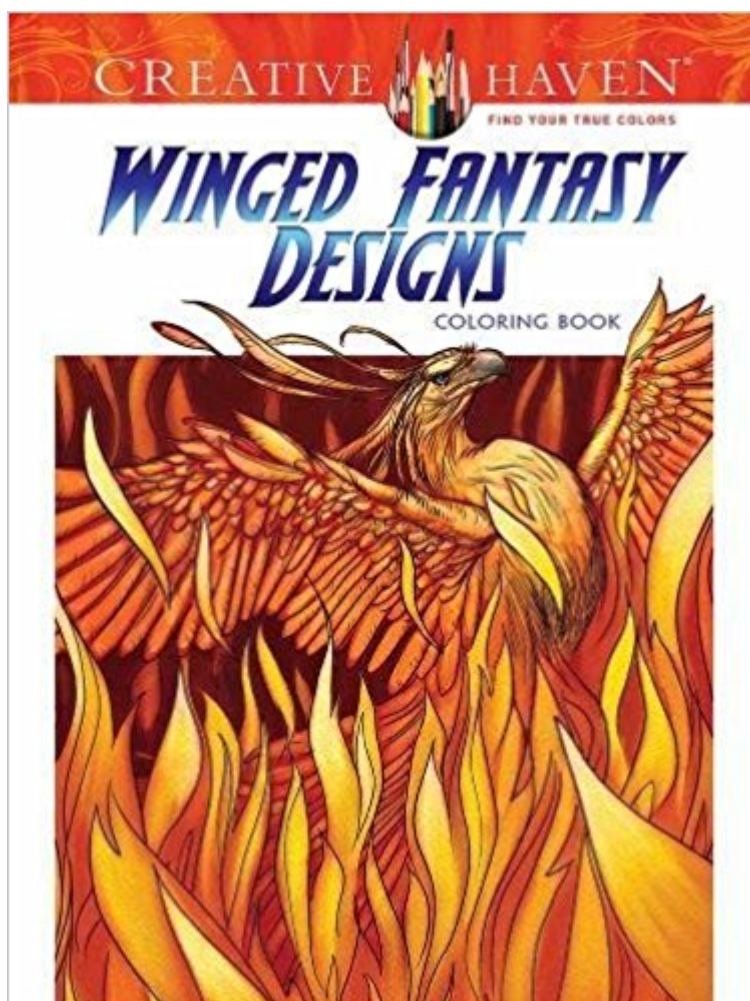

English artist/illustrator Aaron Pocock resides in Brisbane, Australia, where he was chosen to illustrate the Australia Post commemorative stamp set "Mythical Creatures." His other work includes children's books, book covers, CD sleeves, and packaging art.

I have another coloring book by artist Aaron Pocock (Ã¢Â€ÂœFantasy Designs) and enjoyed it so much I purchased this book before I could have a Ã¢Â€ÂœLook InsideÃ¢Â€Â• peak at what it contained. I'm glad that I did so as it is a great representation of fantasy winged creature art. The

range is from curious animals to elegant females and pretty much everything in between. Some of the designs are peaceful and some are quite furious in their aspect. The designs themselves are quite detailed. There is a heavy use of shading. Many of the designs contain intricate spots to color which might require very small nib pens/markers or extremely sharp pencils. Because of that, it might not be for those who have fine motor or vision issues. This is what I saw while coloring in this book and testing the paper with my coloring medium.³¹ Detailed Fantasy designs based on winged animals and creatures The designs are printed one side of the page Paper is the usual Creative Haven quality: white, medium weight, slightly smooth and has perforated pages. Glue Binding but with perforated pages so removing a page is fairly simple. The designs stop well before the perforations Alcohol-based markers bleed through this paper Water-based markers bleed through in spots and show colorful shadows on the back of the page Gel pens and India ink pens leave shadows of color on the back of the page. India ink pens can bleed through when I apply more than one layer of ink. Coloring pencils work well with this paper. I was able to get good color, layer the same color and multiple colors and blend easily using a pencil style blender. I tested both oil and wax-based pencils with similar results. Hard lead pencils, like Verithins, leave dents on the back of the page. I suggest either removing pages from the book to color or using a blotter page under your working page. I like card stock as it keeps ink from seeping through and damaging the pages below.

This adult coloring book has solved a problem for me. I have several young members of my family in their twenties and thirties who are passionately involved in video games, Japanese anime, and fantasy and sci-fi, period. They are bored by "regular," store-bought birthday cards. What I have done when I need to send one of them a birthday card is to scan a page from this coloring book, print it out on art paper in a 5 X 7 format, and after coloring it, fix it to archival-quality colored construction paper to make my own greeting card. I use Prismacolor Premier colored markers to color the images, and the results are quite striking! I am proud to send them these cards!

Disappointed- loved Aaron Pockock's other coloring book, but this is too much of the same type; all winged fantasy, mostly animals. Have seen his artwork on his website, great trolls, etc. Why this book does not have any of these drawings is disappointing.

I'm a coloring enthusiast and was getting bored with Mandalas so I decided to go with something more challenging. Since I'm also a geek this book looked interesting. Creative Haven coloring books are my favorite and as usual this one does not disappoint. Nicely toothed paper, perforated and the

pictures are great. I got a 150ct Prismacolor Premium pencil set for my 61st birthday (yep, I said 61 years young) and I'm going to really enjoy this book and am looking forward to more fantasy books by Creative Haven. Great price & hours of fun. Some of the pictures have light shading to give better ideas on coloring.

I was surprised by the artwork in this book. I own quite a few Creative Haven coloring books, and this was so much better than I expected. The images are highly detailed with crosshatch and line shading, giving them depth. This is truly one of their best books. I hope they do more in this theme.

The best thing about all coloring books by Creative Haven is the paper they are printed on. It is perfect...heavy enough to prevent bleed through, glossy enough so either felt tip or gel pens work beautifully and effortlessly.

The quality of the book is excellent. Creative Haven books have good quality, perforated paper, and all designs are printed on one side. I thought this would be fun, but these designs just don't appeal to my taste as much as I thought they would.

This is an Adult Coloring Book. It was a Christmas gift and was very well received.
